## YONG GEUN KIM ELECTED PRESIDENT OF THE INTERNATIONAL ORGANIZATION OF MOTOR VEHICLE MANUFACTURERS (OICA)

Paris, France, October 31, 2014 — At the occasion of its 2014 General Assembly in Seoul, the International Organization of Motor Vehicle Manufacturers (OICA), representing the global automobile industry, has unanimously elected Yong Geun Kim, President of KAMA, the Korean Automobile Manufacturers Association, as its new president for a 2-year mandate, succeeding Mr Blain of CCFA. OICA is the global automobile industry's accredited representative to the United Nations, and in particular to the bodies in charge of technical regulations.

The election of Mr Kim follows the end of the mandate held since 2011 by Mr Blain.

Mr Kim warmly thanked all OICA members for their confidence and highlighted the structuring role of OICA and the work done by Patrick Blain, with OICA now well recognized as the main source of reliable data not only on world motor vehicle production, but also on sales and fleets.

In turn, Mr Blain pointed out that the election of Mr Kim as new OICA president was the reflection of the growing importance of the Asian region in the automobile industry.

The OICA General Assembly also elected Mr Matthias Wissmann, President of the German Automobile Industry association VDA, as its 1<sup>st</sup> Vice-President.

Finally, the OICA General Assembly also elected Mr Mike Hawes, CEO of the

Society of Motor Manufacturers and Traders in the United Kingdom, and Mr Tarawat

Koomsin, President of the Thai Automobile Industry Association, as new Vice

Presidents, members of the OICA Council, for a 3-year mandate.

Before joining KAMA, Mr. Kim served in the Korean government around

30 years, and has a wide range of experiences on various industrial

sectors and relevant policies until he retired in 2008 as Deputy Minister of

Ministry of Trade, Industry and Energy. After his retirement from the

Korean government, he worked for the Korea Institute for the

Advancement of Technology as President.
